



Army's ITA Emerges as Lead Agency for FDCCI

Washington, DC - The Army's Information Technology Agency (ITA) has eliminated over 30 thousand square feet of data center flooring in an effort to meet the goals of the Federal Data Center Consolidation Initiative (FDCCI).

"As the information technology (IT) service provider for the Pentagon and the National Capital Region (NCR), we consistently strive to meet the technology demands of our customers and support the mission of America's war fighters," said ITA Executive Director Mr. Donald Adcock.

ITA currently hosts mission-essential data on over 65 hundred servers for customers including the White House, the Red Cross, and the entire Headquarters of the Department of the Army. By improving mainframe efficiencies, the agency has increased processor performance by 40 percent. In addition, ITA reduced user-software license cost by 10 percent, and increased server virtualization capacity by 30 percent.

Prior to 2001, agencies in the NCR operated under isolated pillars of IT with multiple server rooms. In an effort to eliminate data center flooring and operate more efficiently, ITA has worked to modernize its IT infrastructure.

"By always increasing the efficiency of the services we provide, our customers are able to better allocate resources towards their critical missions while we take care of their IT needs. It is our goal to work smarter so they don't have to work harder," said Mr. Adcock. The agency continues to identify opportunities to utilize Green IT, reduce costs and environmental impact, increase security, and improve efficiency in support of the ambitious FDCCI.
